CITY OF OXNARD ADDRESSING THE HOMELESS CRISIS

2024 POINT-IN-TIME HOMELESS COUNT

Each year, the Ventura County Continuum of Care coordinates with local cities to conduct a Point-In-Time Count. This initiative helps provide a snapshot of individuals experiencing homelessness.

In 2024, Oxnard experienced a **10.3% reduction** in individuals experiencing homelessness, decreasing from 838 to 752.

Additionally, the City saw a nearly **50% increase placing homeless persons in shelter** due to the integrated efforts between the Oxnard Housing Department, Oxnard Police Department and the County's public health team to address the homeless crisis.



HOUSING DEVELOPMENT INVESTMENTS

California's housing shortage is one of many factors contributing to homelessness. Oxnard is doing its part to help bring new homes to Ventura County. Three new housing projects will be completed in Fiscal Year 2024-25, providing over 200 housing units to help support homeless and low-income households.

CENTRAL TERRACE

35 units of permanent supportive housing for individuals who have experienced long-term homelessness



CASA ALIENTO

69 units of permanent housing for those who are homeless or at risk of homelessness

CASA DE CARMEN

55 units

of permanent supportive housing for individuals who have faced long-term homelessness

HOUSING AUTHORITY VOUCHERS

Vouchers offer rental assistance to help low-income individuals and families secure housing in the private market. Voucher holders contribute 30% to 40% of their household income toward rent, while the Oxnard Housing Authority covers the remaining amount directly to the property owner each month.
